### Principal's Report

- Our School goals this year are:
  - To enhance students academic proficiency in reading, writing and math.
  - To honour, respect and integrate Indigenous ways of knowing and perspectives into our educational framework.
  - All students to have an increased sense of connection and safety.
  - To create a collaborative platform where parents are active, informed, and integral partners in their children's academic development.
- Viewboards are in the classrooms and students/teachers are loving them
- Nutrition grant – we applied for a grant to increase nutrition value in the school – we estimated \$500 for 1 hot lunch a month for the entire school made by the grade 8/9/10 PAA classes – we have received the grant and plan to get things underway this month – first step is the food handling course for all the students involved
- School is getting painted, they were planning to start Sept 24<sup>th</sup>
- Accessibility Survey
- Little Ceasars fundraiser Oct 3-30<sup>th</sup> funds generated go towards the Yearbook

Provincial Education Plan Update NWSD senior administration provided the Board of Education with a progress report on the Provincial Education Plan.
